Respondent shall fully comply with Rule Regulating the Florida Bar 3-5.1(h). In addition, respondent shall accept no new business from the date this order is filed until she is reinstated.


The above matter has been referred to the Chief Judge of the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit for the appointment of a referee pursuant to rule 3-7.2(h).
