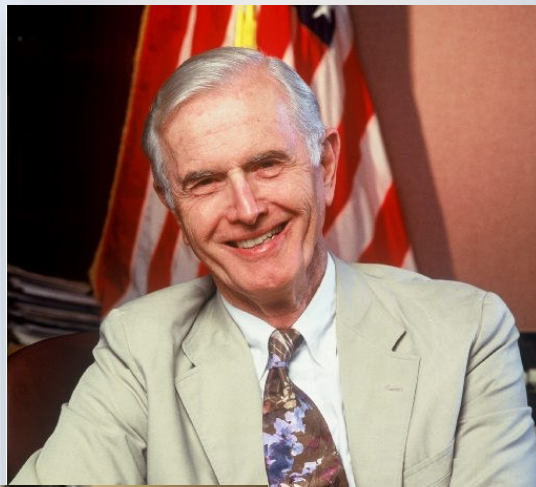

## WILLIAM M. HOEVELER JUDICIAL PROFESSIONALISM AWARD 2018 GUIDELINES

The Florida Bar's Standing Committee on Professionalism is now accepting applications for its William M. Hoeverler Judicial Professionalism Award. The purpose of this award is to recognize a judge who best exemplifies strength of character, competence, commitment and civility as a jurist, lawyer and public servant. Nominees should be **judges in active service**\* who have communicated their dedication to the ideals of justice and demonstrated diligence in inspiring others to the mission of professionalism. The Hoeverler Award will be awarded to the selected nominee at the Florida Bar's Annual Convention during the Judicial Luncheon.

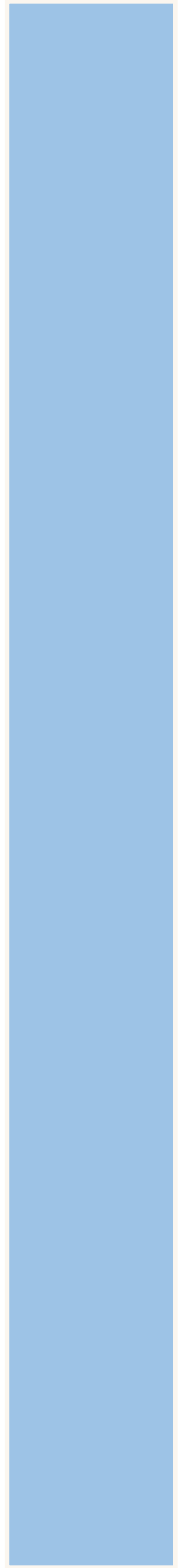
